*The righteous flourish like the palm tree and grow like a cedar in Lebanon. They are planted in the house of the Lord; they flourish in the courts of our God. They still bear fruit in old age; they are **ever full of sap and green**, to declare that the Lord is upright; he is my rock, and there is no unrighteousness in him.*

(Psalm 92:12-15, ESV)

One of my favorite memories of spring as a child was tapping maple trees. My brothers and I would don our mud boots, coats, and work gloves and climb a steep hillside with tools in hand. One person would drill into a sugar maple tree with a hand brace and large drill bit. As the drill bit touched the sapwood layer, the precious sweet liquid would begin flowing. Immediately we would insert a spigot into the tree which caught the sap, channeled it through some tubes, and collected it into a bulk tank at the bottom of the hill. Then the real work began—boiling the sap into the delicious syrup that we all love so much on our pancakes!

The verse above is the only place where the ESV translates the word sap (Job 8:16 and Psalm 104:16 are occasionally translated with the same idea). Psalm 92 was a precious song that the Israelites would sing on their holy days. It was a beautiful reminder for them of God's work among his people. Notice how God's people are described: (1) "the righteous flourish", (2) "they are planted", (3) "they bear fruit", and (4) "they are ever full of sap."

When we tapped maple trees, we could tell a lot about the health of the tree by how well the sap flowed. Sometimes the tree looked healthy on the outside, but lacked sap on the inside. In this case, we could expect that the tree would be partly or completely dead within a year or two. Usually, a lack of sap was an indication of poor roots. How are your roots? Or maybe we should ask, where are your roots seeking nourishment? Psalm 1 warns against the man who *walks not in the counsel of the wicked, [or] stands in the way of sinners, [or] sits in the seat of scoffers*. Instead of flourishing trees, the psalmist says that these individuals are *like chaff that the wind drives away*.

How are your roots today? Are you flourishing spiritually? Are you planted in the house of the Lord? Psalm 1 describes a person who delights regularly in God's Word: *He is like a tree planted by streams of water that yields its fruit in its season, and its leaf does not wither. In all that he does, he prospers*. What a beautiful picture! It is our prayer at Christ the King that our members are firmly rooted in God's Word. We pray regularly that God's people would flourish in their spiritual walk. God never fails on His promise to meet our spiritual need.

Would you join me this spring in considering your spiritual health? Jesus died and rose again to give us abundant life (John 10:10). As we celebrate green grass and Easter Sunday, praise God for new life and pray that each of us in Christ's church are **ever full of sap and green**.

Scripture Memorization and Meditation for the Strong of Heart and for the Faint of Heart

"I will delight in Your statutes; I will not forget Your word." Psalm 119:16

Why is it important for me to memorize and meditate on the Word of God? Here are a few more reasons: 5. It helps us in temptation (Psalm 119:9,11), 6. It trains us for witnessing about Jesus to others (1 Peter 3:14-16), 7. It helps us know God's will (1 Thessalonians 4:1-8), 8. It equips us for defending the truth (Ephesians 6:17), 9. It is more precious than our daily food (Job 23:12; Matthew 4:4), 10. We will grow in our faith in Christ (Colossians 3:16; 2 Peter 3:18).

So, we have considered some of the excuses people use to avoid memory work and some of the reasons to memorize God's Word. But how does a person memorize? Let me encourage you to find what works best for you. For me, these three things have helped. 1. Take a verse at a time, break it into phrases, meditate on it (focus your mind on it), and then say that phrase several times aloud. Read it first, then say it without looking. Next add the previous phrase and say them together. Keep building and repeating. 2. The "Charlotte Mason method of Recitation" is reading aloud the verse or passage you are memorizing once or twice each day. Repeat it daily until you and/or your family has it memorized. 3. Pastor John Piper's method is as follows: "So I would just encourage people to set aside 5 or 10 minutes, and then repeat, repeat, repeat. Read the verse 10 times, say it 10 times, close your Bible, and then review it during the day from a piece of paper." [Desiring God Foundation © 2013. Used by Permission.]

Memorize and meditate on God's Word this month. If you would prefer to memorize more slowly, less verses, or a different section, that is perfectly fine. Do this however it works best for you. Don't, however, neglect or forget God's Word.

March 10, 2022 7:00 PM

President David Sutherland called the meeting to order. Devotions were led by Wayne Smith by reading 1 Corinthians 12:1-26 about the diversity of the spirit and spiritual gifts. Pastor Matthew will lead devotions in April.

The Treasurer's report for February was presented. Jim O. moved to accept the treasurer's report. Seconded by Heather D. Motion carried. There was discussion how the rental deposit was paid. Also the final intern expenses to be paid.

The Payment of bills, Laurie B. moved to approve the bills, seconded by Morgan M. Motion carried.

Outreach was discussed; Jim G. moved to approve outreach, seconded by Laurie B. Motion carried.

Youth Ministry and Family Ministry Reports:

Youth Ministry: Pastor Matthew reported for the Youth ministry. 5 youth and two adults attended the confirmation retreat March 4-6. Saturday Nights Alive (SNA) will be March 12 hosted by CTK. District churches have been invited, Intern Sam will be the speaker and Pastor Jason Holt will be attending as part of Intern Sam's internship requirements.

Family Ministry: Pastor Matthew reported for Family ministry. A family game night planned for April 9.

Pastors' Report: Pastor Tim: Submitted a report for

his activities for the last month. Pastor Tim also listed the names of the new members. The Free Lutheran Bible College Concert Choir will be at CTK on Sunday, April 3. They will be joining us for the soup supper which will be at 6 PM and they will be presenting their concert at 7 PM it will be in place of the Lent service. There will be 19 women, 11 men, and 6 staff; CTK is asked to provide housing for the group. There will be a free will offering at the concert for the choir. Pastor Tim also reported Living Word is asking for help to fill the pulpit as their Pastor will be going on a sabbatical this summer. With Pastor Matthew leaving there will be discussion on how to proceed with confirmation; continue with a three-year program or change to a two year, continue on Sunday mornings or back to Wednesdays.

Pastor Matthew submitted a report for activities for the last month. Pastor Matthew explained more about CTK's role for church planting. May 23-27 there is a church plant intensive in Baltimore that Pastor Matthew and Julia will be attending. There will be discussion next month on reimbursement of costs and time off for the training.

Old Business: Mission Trip: Only Pastor Matthew & Julia went on the mission trip to Nogales, AZ, Feb 21-28.

Shepherding the Shepherd: This will be withdrawn for now.

VBS Update: Tabled. Brandie H will coordinate VBS

Church Plant: Pastor Matthew. There was much discussion about the church plant and the role and responsibilities of CTK. Discussion about the March 20 congregational meeting. Jim Gawerecki moves the following motion to be submitted to the congregation at the March 20, 2022 special congregational meeting: The Trustees and Elders move that Christ the King Free Lutheran Church serve as a sending congregation for Pastor Matthew Pillman including the provided account guidelines. Jim Otter seconded. Motion carried. An email will be sent out to the congregation with information about the congregation meeting on March 20 including there will need to be a quorum and the meeting will be completed in a timely manner.

Informational Committee: Dave S. reported they have had their first meeting.

New Business: Daddy/Daughter Dance: request to make a donation to this. It was done during the outreach discussion.

Replace one of the north doors in the sanctuary: Jim O. will check on it.

Parking Lot repair: Jim G. will check on cost to resurface.

Music/Praise Director: Tabled Brandie H.

PPP Loan: There was discussion at the Annual meeting about using part of the funds for outreach. The specifications of the PPP Loan required funds to be used for payroll and utilities only.

Jim O. moved to adjourn, seconded. Dave S. adjourned the meeting and Pastor Tim closed in prayer.

Christ the King Free Lutheran Church Special Congregation Meeting: March 20, 2022 11:45 AM

A sign in sheet was passed for attendance signatures. 75 in attendance at the meeting; 3 through zoom.

Dave Sutherland calls the meeting to order.

Prayer done by Pastor Matthew Pillman

Dave Sutherland makes the following motion: The Trustees and Elders move that Christ the King Free Lutheran Church serve as a sending congregation for Pastor Matthew Pillman including the provided account guidelines.

Dave Sutherland states the guidelines were placed in the church mailboxes.

Wayne Smith seconds the motion.

Pastor Matthew Pillman states that his and Julia's heart is to share the life-giving message of the forgiveness of sin through the faith in Jesus Christ with 40,000 plus unchurched people in Ankeny, IA. Pastor Matthew is thankful to CTK for asking good questions. He states he is thankful for taking 49 days to pray about this decision and for considering the motion today.

Pastor Matthew states they are not asking for these things. First, they are not asking CTK to be church planting experts or know what is all involved. He is not asking CTK to single handedly fund this project. Lastly, he is not asking CTK for an indefinite time of administrative support.

Pastor Matthew and Julia are asking for the support of the congregation. During the next year's annual meeting it should be asked "where are we at and how are things going"? Pastor is asking for continued prayer from CTK. Also, they are asking to affirm God's call on their heart by being a sending church. They are asking for CTK to be the administrative support and have a restricted fund for people to donate. The restricted account would have funds come in and go out. They cannot draw money out past zero. The last ask is that CTK has unity in the decision. The decision is up to congregation.

Dave Sutherland opened up time for discussion, please use the microphones.

Deb Blaue asks Pastor Matthew to explain the time line. Pastor Matthew states to refer to the phases on the document. Residency begins in August to first of September, 2022. Pastor Mathew would be off the CTK budget by end of July. Residency is one year, then in August 2023 they would be moving to Ankeny, Iowa. At that point, the goal would be to start services. Within one to one and a half years move to a weekly service.

Denis Parsley explains that CTK has recently formed a committee of six members who are determining the direction for CTK going forward. Denis asked if CTK should wait to see what this committee concludes, to see if Pastor Mathew's plan fits in. CTK and Pastor Matthew have never started a church before. Denis states individuals can be contacted to give support. CTK currently supports individuals through outreach funds. CTK should not be put in the middle. Pastor Matthew has funds through January so let them go with the funds they currently have. Then CTK could reevaluate in January to see if the church wants to give or just have individual giving. Denis explains this is a big decision and big decisions take time to make.

Janelle Brockberg states "we also have to take a step of faith".

Dave Sutherland calls for a vote. Yes means you want to be a sending church. No means you do not.

Pastor Tim closes the meeting in prayer.

Alan Warner makes a motion to adjourn the meeting, Jim Otter seconds the motion.

Final count results: 53 yes votes. 21 no votes. 1 abstain.

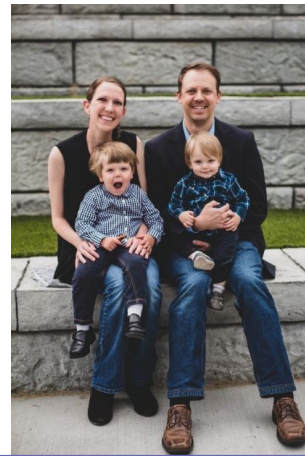

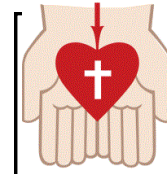

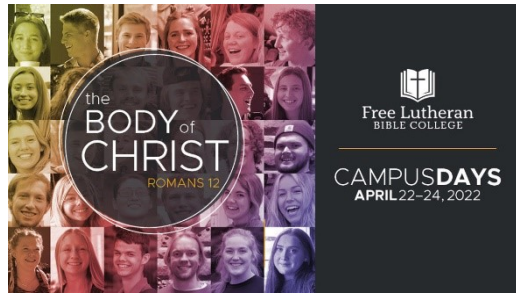

We sure enjoyed having Matt and Julia with us for the week, only wish we could have kept them longer :-). What a blessing to be included in your prayers here in Nogales for the month of April. Lord knows we need your prayers. In April we will lose a large portion of our congregations because they are "snow birds", only spending a few months a year with us. So, it can be discouraging when they leave. Carmen is a lady Alma and I met on our "door to door" visits and has been growing steadily, even during the pandemic. We are now training her in Evangelism Explosion, so we ask for prayer for her zeal to memorize the material and understand what she's learning.

We have almost reached the halfway point of visiting every home in the city of Nogales (7,500 homes) personally with the DVD of the Jesus Film, tracts and invitations to our Church. So we ask for prayer that many people would see, hear and read about our Wonderful Lord Jesus and be saved. Also, as we follow up on the visits, that God would open doors for evangelism and discipleship.

I am praying specifically for a "Timothy" to be able to disciple and train for ministry here at Triumph. Pray God make clear who that person is to me. We still do not have a Sunday School for lack of a teacher!
