#### **Downsizing & Exchanges**

It's probably not the best season to talk about downsizing... or is it? I mean, the Christmas season isn't exactly associated with downsizing. It's the opposite where we eat too much and buy more things. Granted, most of what we buy at Christmas isn't for us, but we also receive quite a few new things. In most cases during this season, our bodies don't exactly downsize nor do our belongings.

However, Christmas is, at its very essence, about downsizing. John 1:1, 14 say, *In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.* <sup>14</sup> *The Word became flesh and dwelt among us. We observed his glory, the glory as the one and only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth.* Did you catch it? Jesus, the Word, was God who became flesh. Maybe you have heard the phrase, "God put skin on?" I would call that a downsize.

By taking on flesh, Jesus was opening Himself up to sickness, disease, pain, hurt, hunger and even death. That's a definite downsize. In fact, Philippians 2:7-8 add, instead he emptied himself by assuming the form of a servant, taking on the likeness of humanity. And when he had come as a man, <sup>8</sup> he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death—even to death on a cross.

The Omnipresent One (everywhere present) downsized to the confines of a human womb. The Omnipotent One (all-powerful) became a helpless baby that had to be fed, nursed, burped and changed. The Omniscient One (all knowing) had to learn reading, writing, and arithmetic. He emptied Himself and became nothing so that we could become something.

So, Christmas is about downsizing, but it is also about exchanges. The customer service counters of retail stores are probably busier right after Christmas than they are all the rest of the year. People need to exchange clothing that doesn't fit or duplicate gifts or gifts they just don't like. Hopefully, the retail store has a simple exchange policy.

Jesus offered the world an unbelievable exchange with the greatest exchange policy ever conceived. Second Corinthians 5:21 says, "He who knew no sin became sin for us so that we could become the righteousness of God." In other words, Jesus says, "Give me all of your sin and I'll give you all of my righteousness." That's like being able to exchange the ugliest, cheesiest outfit ever made for a prepaid credit card with an unlimited dollar amount. Okay, even that pales in comparison to Jesus' offered exchange.

How about the exchange described in John 3:16, For God loved the world in this way: He gave his one and only Son, so that everyone who believes in him will not perish but have eternal life. The exchange is sin for perfect righteousness and eternal death for eternal life. I'm really liking Jesus' version of downsizing and exchanges. He downsized just so He could offer us the greatest exchange policy ever known.

How do we receive such an exchange? Through believing in Jesus as our Savior. No wonder the angels sang, *Glory to God in the highest, and* 

on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased! Doesn't is make your heart start singing,

"Glo . . . ri . a, In Excelsis deo?



The Elders are discussing various options for the small group study. Details will be shared as they become available. Please watch the bulletin and January Messenger for more information.






