Love

1 John 4:10-11 "In this is love, not that we have loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins. Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another."

In these verses God presents Love radically different from what the world calls "love". God does not call us to love nothing except Him, but to love nothing more than Him. If we love Him, we will love what He loves, and we will love



sacrificially, as He does. C.S. Lewis has some profound thoughts on this in his book "The Four Loves".

"This is what comes, he [Augustine] says, of giving one's heart to anything but God. Do not let your happiness depend on something you may lose. If love is to be a blessing, not a misery, it must be for the only Beloved who will never pass away.

Of all arguments against love none makes so strong an appeal to my nature as "Careful! This might lead you to suffering". To my nature, my temperament, yes. Not to my conscience. When I respond to that appeal, I seem to myself to be a thousand miles away from Christ.

I doubt whether there is anything in me that pleases Him less. And who could conceivably begin to love God on such a prudential ground—because the security (so to speak) is better? Who could even include it among the grounds for loving? Would you choose a wife or a Friend—if it comes to that, would you choose a doq—in this spirit?

We follow One who wept over Jerusalem and at the grave of Lazarus, and, loving all, yet had one disciple whom, in a special sense, he "loved". St. Paul has a higher authority with us than St. Augustine—St. Paul who shows no sign that he would not have suffered like a man, and no feeling that he ought not so to have suffered, if Epaphroditus had died. (Phil. 2:27).

Even if it were granted that insurances against heartbreak were our highest wisdom, does God Himself offer them? Apparently not. Christ comes at last to say "Why hast thou forsaken me?" There is no escape along the lines St. Augustine suggests. Nor along any other lines. There is no safe investment. To love at all is to be vulnerable. Love anything, and your heart will certainly be wrung and possibly be broken. If you want to make sure of keeping it intact, you must give your heart to no one, not even to an animal. Wrap it carefully round with hobbies and little luxuries; avoid all entanglements; lock it up safe in the casket or coffin of your selfishness. But in that casket—safe, dark, motionless, airless—it will change. It will not be broken; it will become unbreakable, impenetrable, irredeemable. The alternative to tragedy, or at least to the risk of tragedy, is damnation.

Christ did not teach and suffer that we might become ... more careful of our own happiness. If a man is not uncalculating towards the earthly beloveds whom he has seen, he is none the more likely to be so towards God whom he has not. We shall draw nearer to God, not by trying to avoid the sufferings inherent in all loves, but by accepting them and offering them to Him; throwing away all defensive armour. If our hearts need to be broken, and if He chooses this as the way in which they should break, so be it." (CS Lewis, The Four Loves)



As a family we are very excited to be moving to our new home in the coming months (hopefully April 2022)! We are moving to a little farming town about 20 minutes from Cuenca, Ecuador. In order to save money, we have been staying with Darwin's parents for almost a year now while our house is being built. We are thankful for their love, kindness, and patience! Over the last year, we have adjusted to living with the basics and in smaller spaces, but this adjustment has also made us all very excited to have our own space in our new house. Our home is truly a gift from the Lord in many ways. Ironically, we had no plans to purchase a home let alone buy land in order to build our own home a year ago. The Lord opened so many doors as well as guided us through close friends & family very quickly for us to be able to receive this gift of a home in a beautiful, peaceful location.

In regard to our church "La Paz de Dios," we had been meeting in the gym of a school next to our church for over a year due to space issues and covid related regulations. We are so thankful to share that we were able to open our sanctuary space more in order to return to worship in our own building. We are "home" again in our sanctuary. Because of these changes in our sanctuary, Darwin also relocated to another office in our building and is enjoying his new space. Darwin continues working as the full-time pastor at La Paz de Dios with responsibilities that include preaching, teaching, counseling, discipling, etc. We are thankful for our part-time senior pastor, but he is considering serving in another ministry elsewhere. We have a larger and growing congregation so we are hoping to hire another part-time pastor in the coming months.

Kirsten continues homeschooling Daniel (11) and Nathan (8). She is relearning Science, History, and math concepts as she teaches them to her boys. She also enjoys her home-making jobs, especially cooking! When friends and family taste her Ecuadorian dishes, they note no difference in the traditional food even though the "gringa" had been the cook in the kitchen. However, she is excited to get into crafts again when we move to our new house & are able to unpack all the crafty things from storage.

Daniel a& Nathan are learning to care for animals with our dog "Happy" & our rabbit "Oreo." They love to go to our land/construction site to run around with the dog.
