



Missionary of the Month:

Matthew & Ednay; Zoey, Ian Abel serving in Paraguay

Mafú (Matthew Abel) is a third-generation missionary, graduate of AFLBS, has his bachelor's degree in Intercultural Studies from the University of Northwestern, he has worked with YWAM in China, USA, Panamá and Brazil and he has earned his MDiv from Faith Evangelical Lutheran Seminary (FIU).

Ednay graduated as a physical therapist in Brazil, before working with YWAM in the Amazon. Ednay has also studied at AFLBS.

We were commissioned as AFLC missionaries at the 2015 Annual Conference. Since then we have served the Brazilian Free Lutheran Church in many different ways (Pastoral, Bible Camp, Chaplain, Evangelistic and mercy ministries) as the Lord has directed our steps. This year (2019) the Lord opened the door for pioneer church-planting in Paraguay. (We received the following email)

We are working with the local Bethany Fellowship church here in Luque PY until June of 2020. We will then move to a new area to begin a new missionary work among the unreached.

Our son Ian Mateo Abel was born on Jan 8th at 22:00 and is healthy. He is truly Paraguayan! Zoey is 18months old and is a great big sister. She is joyful and friendly and is very kind toward her brother. She also is learning 4 languages (Portuguese, English, Spanish and Grarani)

We are taking language classes (Guarani) and applying ourselves to language acquisition.
