Given the sharp decline in moral values, the harsh tone in politics, the unbelievable deterioration of the family and sky-rocketing crime and violence, it's easy to think negative about our future. This is all without even mentioning the struggles you may be experiencing.

Will our future be better? Jesus' miracle at the wedding in Cana, suggests that, in God's Kingdom, the best is yet to come. John 2:9-10 (NIV) says,

The master of the banquet tasted the water that had been turned into wine. He did not realize where it had come from, though the servants who had drawn the water knew. Then he called the bridegroom aside ¹⁰ and said, "Everyone brings out the choice wine first and then the cheaper wine after the guests have had too much to drink; but you have saved the best till now."

The banquet master didn't know who had provided the new wine. He just knew that it was better than the wine that had been served earlier. He also knew that this was unusual. Most hosts served the best wine first, but at this wedding the best was served last.

If we were to review the past year, I'm sure we would see times of failure and hopefully, times of success. Perhaps some can only see failure or regret or struggle or loss. If that describes you, don't let yourself camp there and don't let anyone else shade your future.

Though it was unusual at a wedding in Bible times, the miracle of Jesus turning water into wine, suggests something about the kingdom of God. The best is yet to come. The blessings we experience in our life with God, the goodness of God's creation, the joy of Christmas, the consolation that comes from God's presence, the freedom that comes with forgiveness—all these are just a taste of the new life God has promised in Jesus.

So, the important question is, "Where are you at with Jesus?" Do you trust in Him as your Savior from sin? Do you trust His Word? Are you His follower? If so, then look at this New Year with anticipation. You

usually find what you're looking for. So, what are you looking for? Jesus says in reference to His Kingdom, "Seek and you will find." And when you do seek, you will most likely find yourself experiencing what the banquet master exclaimed, "You have saved the best till now!"

Christmas Eve offering: Heather D. moved seconded by Jim O. to give offering to the Sioux Falls Prison Ministry. Motion carried.





Greetings Christ the King Church family! {Please forgive the beach picture... We couldn't resist!} As we turn the calendar to the New Year, we want to give you an update on some details and prayer requests for our church planting residency here in San Antonio. It is crazy to think that we are already one third of

the way through our time in TX.

First off, thank you for sticking by our side as our sending church! We recognize that many questions still remain as to what "sending church" exactly means. Please keep the questions coming! Your questions help us consider how we can grow and how Christ the King can most effectively serve in its role. What I can say is that your prayer, administrative, and financial support is truly what makes our mission venture possible. Never underestimate your crucial role. By your support and in Christ's strength, we seek to do what the CTK missions statement says: "We are dedicated to fulfilling the Great Commission by proclaiming the Gospel of Jesus Christ to all people..."

Second, here is a short glimpse into what our residency looks like. Our goal during the residency is to grow in Christ-likeness, develop church planting skills, and define mission/vision/values for the Ankeny church plant. To do this, Matthew spends 40-50% of his time serving alongside Pastor Matthew Ballmann in the day-to-day activities of ministry and church planting. Another 20-30% of Matthew's (and Julia's) time is spent in evangelism and outreach (examples: neighborhood get-togethers, a gym membership, community sports, intentional conversations, special events, etc.). The last 20-30% is spent on continued learning, administration, and preparation for Ankeny, IA.

Last of all, please continue to surround our ministry in prayer. Satan would like nothing better than to undermine the advancement of the Gospel by putting up roadblocks of any sort! Here is a short list of specific prayer requests at this time: Pray for Julia's final weeks of pregnancy and a safe delivery (due February 10)

Pray that God would give us wisdom to encourage neighbors going through difficult times
Pray for protection of our boys' hearts in all the transition (they still miss their Pipestone friends)
Pray for the preparations for a short-term missions' trip from Christ the King
Pray for Trinity Church as local leaders taking a larger role in the function of the church
Pray that our hearts remain open to the Holy Spirit's prompting and leading in our life

Space here does not allow for a more detailed update. Please refer to our report in the CTK Annual Report. We seek to answer questions on the financial and logistical progress of the church plant!

God has Given Peace

For each issue of this newsletter one of our team members or a visiting volunteer writes about the work of mission here in Alaska. I received a call today asking about what is going on and I said that I had been away 70+ days...

After an agonizing wait to be seen by a doctor, Margaret was told there was a mass in her chest that could be pneumonia or something else. She was 3,700 miles from our home, visiting family for the summer. She was to begin her thirteenth year at our village school. We don't

have a hospital in our tri-village borough, nor a doctor. An excellent clinic takes care of most medical issues, but major problems must be dealt with 300 miles away in Anchorage, reached only by air.

On her way home in July she stopped in Anchorage for school training at a tribal council. Her attendance was immediately cut short by a second visit to an emergency room. This time a doctor ordered more extensive testing and it was determined she had inoperable third-stage lung cancer.

From Margaret's initial note on CaringBridge:

"God is so good, and has arranged this time for us to enjoy each other and rejoice in the Lord! God has given both of us such peace, knowing that He is in control of our lives. Whether we find out that I will be going home to be with Jesus in a few short weeks, or whether He will give me more time on earth, I rejoice. I look forward to being with my Lord God whom I serve! His will be done. I trust Him completely."



Prayer needs:

- * Continued prayers of stamina for those serving here, especially as winter sets in. Pray for a pastor to be called to serve here.
- * Revival in Naknek and beyond.
- *Safety in flying and good weather
- *Winter maintenance projects

Margaret says this has been the toughest challenge she has ever had. Everything else pales in comparison: cerebral malaria, rabies shots, civil war, martial law, cobras and kraits in our home, carjacking, spinal injury, evacuating from Ebola, taking refuge in our American embassy, emergency delivering our grandson; our children suffering from whooping cough, a lethal dose of malaria medicine, paralysis, rabies shots, and multiple medevacs. [Since July to just a few weeks ago she has had thirty-five radiation treatments and two rounds of chemotherapy. She came home with a good report. Now she is currently in Anchorage for two weeks for some follow up radiation on her brain that was recommended by her doctor.]

Words cannot express how thankful we are for Dave and Marilee (Margaret's cousin) opening their home in Palmer to us; our Alaska team covering my work in Naknek (Jeremy, Lacey, Josh, Heather, Jeff & Jane), and for all of you who pray, support, and encourage us. Most of all we are thankful for the healing and strength our Lord Jesus has brought her.

"Oh Lord hear my prayer, listen to my cry for mercy; in your faithfulness and righteousness come to my relief." Psalm 143:1 Hear my cry, O God; listen to my prayer. From the ends of the earth I call to you, I call as my heart grows faint; lead me to the rock that is higher than I. For you have been my refuge, a strong tower against the foe." Psalm 61:1-3
