Vacation

Vacation is on my mind. Cindy and I are leaving for Glacier National Park in a few days (from the time of this writing). But is vacation Biblical? Well, that depends... Jesus encouraged His disciples to take a sort of vacation in Mark 6:30-32.

³⁰ The apostles gathered around Jesus and reported to him all that they had done and taught. ³¹ He said to them, "Come away by yourselves to a remote place and rest for a while." For many people were coming and going, and they did not even have time to eat. ³² So they went away in the boat by themselves to a remote place.

Unfortunately for the disciples, the people followed them and their plans for a break took a hiatus. However, after the feeding of the five thousand, Mark 6:45 says, "Immediately he (Jesus) made his disciples get into the boat and go ahead of him to the other side, to Bethsaida, while he dismissed the crowd." It seems that Jesus recognized their need for a break by sending His disciples onward and staying to dismiss the crowd.

If you keep reading in this chapter of Mark, notice what happens in verses 47-51,

⁴⁷ Well into the night, the boat was in the middle of the sea, and he was alone on the land. ⁴⁸ He saw them straining at the oars because the wind was against them. Very early in the morning he came toward them walking on the sea and wanted to pass by them. ⁴⁹ When they saw him walking on the sea, they thought it was a ghost and cried out, ⁵⁰ because they all saw him and were terrified. Immediately he spoke with them and said, "Have courage! It is I. Don't be afraid." ⁵¹ Then he got into the boat with them, and the wind ceased. They were completely astounded.

Notice that Jesus saw them straining at the oars, and what did He do? He came to them, walking on the water. They were astounded. Do you think they learned something that night on "vacation?" Do you think their "vacation" helped prepare them for the ministry and circumstances to come? Do you think their faith grew while on "vacation?" I think this was Jesus' plan all along. He would use some of their time away to help them know Him more and prepare them for the future.

Could that be the Biblical reason for vacation or getting away? It's not so much an escape from work and life as it is an opportunity for rejuvenation, knowing Jesus in a new and fresh way, as well as a preparation for the future. God calls us to work and provides work for us to do as a provision and a ministry. Rather than vacation being an escape from work, it is a rejuvenation for work.


I encourage you vacationers (me included), to look for God's handiwork in creation and keep a look out for Jesus, especially when something seems to go wrong such as botched reservations, car trouble, wrong turns, etc. Let yourself be astounded by the presence of Jesus. He is always found in the Word of God. Let those around you be astounded by His presence in you. "Where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom" (2 Corinthians 3:17).

Trustee Meeting Minutes Christ The King Free Lutheran Church June 10, 2021 7 PM

Present: Jim Gawerecki, Dave Sutherland, Jim Otter, Morgan McNickle, Marcine Olsen, Laurie Bruns. Absent: Heather De Wilde, Bill VanderPlaats, Brandie Hulstein **Also Present**: Pastor Tim, Intern Sam Willard, Collene Landgren, Mike Morgan, Wayne Smith.

President Jim Gawerecki called the meeting to order. Devotions were led by Pastor Tim reading from several verses on a theme. Beginning with Matthew 13:41 gladly sell all have for the kingdom of heaven, ending with Matthew 10:8 the kingdom of heaven is a free gift to us. But we need to receive it, God wants everyone to be able to have the treasure of heaven. Pastor Tim led in prayer. Dave Sutherland will lead devotions in July.

Elders' Consultation: Wayne Smith represented the Elders. Due to a series of scheduling conflicts, they have not met. Their main topic for the next meeting is how to best utilize two pastors and an intern.

COVID report: As of 06/10/2021 Pipestone County reported 1,165 cases (includes confirmed and probable) and 26 deaths. The trustees feel the COVID report is no longer necessary for the meeting.

The Treasurer's report for May was presented. Jim O. moved to accept the treasurer's report. Seconded by Laurie B. Motion carried.

Treasurer Mike Morgan reported the forgiveness was approved for the PPP Cares Loan and the paper work has been received. The accounting adjustment to remove the loan from the liabilities and move the \$ 25,000 to revenue was made.

The Payment of bills, Laurie B. moved to approve the bills, seconded by Jim O. Motion carried.

Outreach was discussed; Dave S. moved to approve outreach, seconded by Jim O. Motion carried.

ministry. The laundry ministry will involve being at the laundry mat and offering to pay for people's laundry, serving coffee, and greeting people. The walk by ministry involves setting up a table by the Calico Cat and offering water as people are walking the square. A progressive dinner is being discussed as a possibility later this summer.

Pastors' Report: Pastor Tim submitted a report of activities for the last month. Pastor Tim, Pastor Matthew, and Intern Sam will set up a schedule to visit shut ins and those with limited mobility. The ministerial did a Good Sam blitz and visited every room and resident in one hour. There will be an adult VBS class Sunday through Thursday, June 13-17. The AFLC annual conference is June 16-19. Pastor Tim will be on vacation June 24-July 4. Pastor Matthew was on family leave as Benjamin was born June 5.



Praise God that they finally got my headaches and chronic migraine under control!!! Josh is working with LBT for next steps with both work and his study program. The Themne project is doing very well and just finished consultant-checking the book of Ezekiel! Thank you for your support. - Ruthie The following is an excerpt from their newsletter

Though I (Ruthie) am on short-term disability, I can monitor their progress and activities from our home in Northfield. Our LBT colleague in Sierra Leone, Amy Formella, has agreed to help advise the project in my absence. Despite many health challenges last year, much of my time was spent in training and working with the team to work independently from outside involvement.

Josh traveled to Sierra Leone in the spring, we continue to work remotely, Josh studies and writes.

The good news is that Ruthie is doing much better than when we returned in February. She is now out of bed more often than in bed and is able to keep up with the kids and house on most days. After
