

Overwhelmed?

Be still, and know that I am God. I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth! Psalm 46:10

The title question is true of everyone at certain times. Work, relationships, finances, school, life can all provide times and feelings of being overwhelmed. I'm kind of experiencing that feeling



right now (Wednesday). I'm planning to help at the Food Shelf Thursday afternoon. This article was due Sunday and I have a newspaper article due Monday morning. I also have a Sunday morning sermon and Sunday evening Lent sermon to put together as well as a service and message for Good Sam & Ridgeview this Sunday. Of course, I have several visits and phone calls I would like to make this week as well. Oh, and then there's taxes. Overwhelmed? A little. Well, maybe more than a little.

This is where God often chooses to speak into our lives and remind us of who He is. This morning, Psalm 46 jumped into my mind. Verse 10 says, "Be still." Some versions say, "Cease striving," or "Stop your fighting". It's God's way of telling us to quit acting like everything is dependent upon us and our abilities. In the context of this Psalm, God is telling the Israelites to stop fighting as if the battle's outcome is determined by their strength. It says twice in this Psalm, "The Lord of Armies is with us; the God of Jacob is our stronghold." God even invites them in verse eight to "Come, see the works of the Lord."

So, God wants us to stop long enough to reflect on who He is. "Be still, and know that I am God." According to this Psalm, what do we find out about God? Verse one, "God is our refuge and strength, a helper who is always found in times of trouble." Verse six, "the earth melts when He lifts His voice." Verse nine, "He makes wars cease" and "He shatters bows and cuts spears to pieces; He sets wagons ablaze." This is His way of saying that He can handle an entire army or even multiple nations all at once. In verse 10, God says, "I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth!"

God tells us that not only can He handle all of Israel's problems, but He will be exalted in His handling of it. Think He can handle your issues? Think He can handle mine? Think our striving, worry, fighting will make it better? What does God say? "Be still, and know that I am God." Let's not leave this most important instruction out of our daily work, relationships, finances, school-life and life itself.

When all is said and done come Monday morning, will there be evidence of God's work in my supposed overwhelming schedule? God will be exalted! That's the blessing of repeatedly following God's instruction. Over time, you see Him work and become more and more convinced that you need and even want Him to move in all you do. And even though you have your moments of feeling overwhelmed, the time of "Be still" reflection reminds and renews your thinking to a quiet confidence.

What will you do the next time you feel overwhelmed? I suppose that depends upon whether you want to gut it out yourself or whether you want to see God's hand in it all. It might even depend on who you want to see glorified in it? God's instruction brings peace.

Devotions were led by Jim Gawerecki by reading from Psalm 121:1-8. My help comes from the Lord, He does not sleep or slumber and He keeps watch over us. 
Other: Pastor Tim reported Harlan Moss would like to share about the Prison ministry with CTK. Trustees approved allowing his to come share during a worship service.

Scripture Memorization and Meditation for the Strong of Heart & for the Faint of Heart

"I will delight in Your statutes; I will not forget Your word." Psalm 119:16 Why is it important for me to memorize and meditate on the Word of

God? Let me offer a few reasons:

- 1. Jesus memorized Scripture (Cf. Matthew 4:1-12)
- 2. Some portions of Scripture are especially designed for ease of memorization. For example: in Psalm 119 each section begins with one of the 22 Hebrew letters. Each of eight verses begin with the next letter—Aleph, Beth, Gimel, etc.—for a total of 176 verses.
- 3. The Church Militant (the Church on earth) is at war and one of its powerful weapons to wield is the sword of the Spirit in this warfare. Next, not for guilt, but for a reminder of reality around us—
- 4. Many Christians would risk death to be able to have and read the Bible in their possession. Even one book!

If you are still with me on this journey to memorize Scripture, the book of Ephesians in particular, congratulations! The last section of chapter of one is difficult. Much of chapter one was originally written as one sentence. There is a lot to unpack in this chapter. But now we are in chapter two. Here we find a beautiful description of our natural condition apart from Christ and a breath-taking explanation of our salvation in Jesus through God's underserved favor. This is an excellent portion of Scripture to use when sharing the law and gospel with Christians and non-Christians alike. Meditate on these verses. Let them be motivation for your praise and worship of our Triune God.

If three verse a week is too difficult, chose a portion and memorize that. Do it at your own speed. Find a study partner. Something is better than nothing. God's Word in our lives will always be beneficial and will always bear fruit.
