Philemon 4–7 “I thank my God always when I remember you in my prayers, because I hear of your love and of the faith that you have toward the Lord Jesus and for all the saints, and I pray that the sharing of your faith may become effective for the full knowledge of every good thing that is in us for the sake of Christ. For I have derived much joy and comfort from your love, my brother, because the hearts of the saints have been refreshed through you.”

What does it mean to refresh? Webster’s Dictionary says it means to REVIVE 1: to restore strength and animation to; to RENOVATE 2: to freshen up, and 3a: to restore or maintain by renewing supply.

In his letter to Philemon, Paul thanks him for refreshing the hearts of the saints. How do you refresh the heart of a person? How do you restore strength and life to a soul? Some vacation and “me” time can help refresh your body and mind, but Paul speaks of something different here that refreshes the soul, the heart of the person. Paul speaks of the refreshing that comes from the sharing of faith. Paul prays that the sharing of our faith may become effective for the full knowledge of every good thing that is in us for the sake of Christ. In other words, as we share with one another the faith we have in Jesus Christ for us, we more fully realize the good things that we have from God, and we recognize that we have these because of Christ.

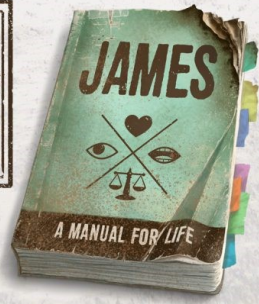
Have you discovered how true this is? Some of the most encouraging experiences are when I randomly meet some who loves Jesus, and there’s that moment when we both realize we love and follow Jesus Christ, and we want to share and talk about Him and what He has done in our lives, and what He means to us. And because we both love Jesus, there is a love for anyone else who loves Jesus. This sharing of faith refreshes the soul because it restores that joy of faith, and because it renews the hope we have in Jesus Christ. There is joy and comfort when others express their faith in Jesus Christ, their love for Him, and their love for all those who love Him. This refreshes you. But you are also refreshed when you share your faith and love with others.

Rachel and I, and our boys want to thank all of you for refreshing us. If I would sum up this year in one word, it would be: Refreshing. This has been a refreshing season for us: body, mind, and spirit. For me it has also been a season of shaping and molding, as I’ve learned more what it means to be a Pastor, and how God wants to use the unique gifts He’s given me for this ministry. Everyone of you has been a part of this refining process. But most of all I thank you for refreshing us with your hospitality, your faith, and your love.

My prayer for you is that the sharing of your faith may become effective for the full knowledge of every good thing that is in us for the sake of Christ. That you would have comfort and joy from Christ. That your hearts would be continually be refreshed. And that you would refresh the hearts of many by your own faith and love.

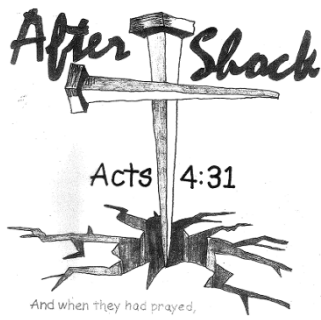

\* In May our family is traveling to Athens, Greece to volunteer with a ministry called Hellenic Ministries that serves refugees. We're so excited and grateful to have this opportunity to serve with them and to see what God is doing there. We'll spend a week with them and a

week touring around as a family. From there, our family will part ways for a time... I (Rhoda) will fly back to the U.S. with our 2 oldest, Elijah and Judah. Elijah will be attending FLBC in the fall and working on the campus for the summer, and Judah and I will spend several weeks with family before returning in July. Please pray for our family as we say goodbye to Elijah - it's not going to be easy to return to Uganda without him! And please pray for Elijah as he begins this exciting new chapter of his life. We'd be grateful too for your prayers over our time in Greece.

\*Please pray for the church here in our village (Nabukosi). It was birthed a few years ago from the discipleship group that Nate has led for the past five years, and it consists mostly of the families of the men in that group, plus some of their neighbors. It has been beautiful to see the spiritual hunger and growth in this church, and we praise God for what He is doing in their midst. Please pray for protection over their gathering -- spiritual opposition is evident as there are many strongholds in this area, territory given to the enemy that he does not want to relinquish. \*Please pray for wisdom for Nate & me as we raise our kids and seek to point them to Christ.


