


To mask or not to mask; is that really the question?

I am very grateful to be serving a congregation that is not seriously taking sides over the question of mask or

no mask. I know that people have differing opinions about the efficacy of wearing masks and that there is conflicting information given, even from the experts. But churches are experiencing deep divisions based upon this one issue. Obviously, God does not want this.

The title question got me thinking about Paul's letter to Titus. In verse five of the first chapter, Paul tells Titus, "The reason I left you in Crete was to set right what was left undone and, as I directed you, to appoint elders in every town."



The Apostle Paul wanted everyone on the island of Crete to know Jesus and have eternal life (1:1-2), so he left Titus there to minister to them. Titus' main mission was to lead people to the knowledge of the truth (Jesus).

However, Paul warns Titus that there are many rebellious people (1:10) and that Cretans can be liars, evil and lazy gluttons (1:12-13). He further instructs Titus to "avoid foolish debates, genealogies, quarrels, and disputes about the law, because they are unprofitable and worthless" (3:9). In other words, Paul is telling Titus not to major in minor things.

Ravi Zacharias warns Christians of turning "either/or" issues into "both/and" issues. For example, it wouldn't be Biblically right to say that Jesus is one way to heaven and there are other ways to heaven as well. Jesus said in John 14:6, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." The way to the Father is clearly an "either/or" issue, not a "both/and" issue. There is only one way to heaven. Multiple ways cannot be biblically right. "Either/or" issues are central and should be defended.

What often happens among Christians and churches is that people get off the main mission of our Christian faith and start treating everything as an "either/or" issue. Before you know it, you have people foolishly debating the color of the carpet or walls. People start quarreling over the kinds of worship music. Members have hot disputes over whether or not everyone should or shouldn't wear a mask in worship.

There is an old nursery rhyme that goes like this:

Pussy cat, pussy cat, where have you been? I've been to London to see the queen. Pussy cat, pussy cat, what did you there? I frightened a little mouse under a chair.

The poor pussy cat planned to see the queen, but got sidetracked by a mouse only to miss the queen. In essence, the pussy cat got so focused on what was minor that he missed the major purpose for his visit to London.

And so, the Apostle Paul, warns Titus, "But avoid foolish debates, genealogies, quarrels, and disputes about the law, because they are unprofitable and worthless." Instead, the Apostle Paul instructs Titus to set right what was left undone and to appoint elders in every town. He wanted Titus to focus on helping the people of Crete to know Jesus.

Knowing Jesus and helping others to know Him is our major and mission. As I hear testimonies from pastors and parishioners of great division due to things like masks or no masks, I am grateful to be serving among you. I know many of us have opinions in these areas, but none have made them divisive. As a result, we can major in knowing Jesus and making Him known.

Jesus may block where we shouldn't go, we need to let God lead our lives. Heather D. led in prayer. Morgan McNickle will lead devotions in November.

Elders' Consultation: Wayne Smith represented the Elders and reported they have monitoring how and where worship has been taking place. There really hasn't been any concerns voiced about how we are holding services.

COVID report: As of 10/8/2020 Pipestone county reported 292 cases and 15 deaths.

The Treasurer's report for September was presented. Dave S. moved to accept treasurer's report. Seconded by Jim O. Motion carried.

The Payment of bills, Dave S. moved to approve the bills, seconded by Laurie B. Motion carried.

Mike Morgan reported the Pipestone City Coronavirus Aid, Relief & Economic Security (CARES) Act grant funds were received. Dave S. moved, seconded by Jim O. to refuse the funds due to concerns with the requirements. Motion carried. **Outreach was discussed**; Dave S. moved to approve outreach, seconded by Laurie B. Motion carried.

Pastors' Report: Pastor Tim submitted a report of activities for the last month. The pastors have been trying to balance and be sensitive to those who feel strong about wearing or not wearing masks.

Pastor Matthew requested vacation time November 5-10.

Morgan M. moved to approve, seconded by Laurie B. Motion carried. Pastor Matthew reported there are many people involved in different activities on Sunday mornings, from the Sunday school teachers to the technology people, those helping with communion etc. There have been several opportunities for group prayers: See You @ the Pole, at the Courthouse lawn, some teachers and pastors walk the perimeter of the school Tuesday mornings praying for the students and staff. 12 people are interested in the San Antonio mission trip.

Old Business: Review of CTK Constitution: Tabled: The trustees continue to review the constitution. Elder recommendation for guidelines during a pandemic: Wayne S. asked if anyone had questions about the recommended guidelines. Laurie B. moved to accept the guidelines and have them added to the policy book, seconded by Heather D. Motion carried. Bench in foyer: Tabled: Morgan M. reported the person he spoke to didn't do that kind of woodwork. Laurie B. will check for benches at a couple of local furniture stores.

San Antonio Mission Trip: Pastor Matthew reported 12 people are interested in the mission trip. There will be another meeting October 25.

Playground equipment: Still needs to be stained. **Bus**: The repairs have been completed. The starter & alternator were replaced. The bill was \$ 701.59 **Projector for sanctuary**: Dave S. moved to purchase the VAVA 4K UHD Laser projector for \$2,800, seconded

Use of church building: Bill Koch & Makenzie DeRuyter requested to use the church for their wedding on August 28, 2021. Laurie B. moved to approve, second by Heather D. Motion carried.

Other: Laurie B. requested a key to the church for Sunday school. Was approved.

Dave S. moved to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Matthew A., Jim G. adjourned the meeting. Pastor Matthew closed in prayer.
