Evaluation

Last summer we conducted an official Know Your Church Survey. I was reminded of this while reading about the seven churches in chapters two and three of Revelation. All the churches were basically being exhorted to evaluate themselves based upon the message of Jesus to each of them.



Though our Know Your Church survey analysis is not Jesus Word to us, it does supply us an avenue to try to take an objective peek at ourselves.

Forty-one members of the church completed that online survey out of the 140 who started the survey. One of the areas where we absolutely excelled was in doctrine where we scored very healthy or healthy on a scale of very healthy, healthy, marginally healthy down to marginally unhealthy, unhealthy and very unhealthy. I also noticed that we scored very healthy to healthy on what we believed or personally experienced in the areas of prayer, worship, fellowship and discipleship.

However, when we start dissecting what we are doing as a church in some of these areas including ministry and evangelism, we start seeing the very unhealthy rating coming to the service. For example, in evangelism, our church scores healthy in how we support missionaries and allocate our budget accordingly, but we score very unhealthy in that our growth has come primarily through transfer membership and people generally believe that there are enough churches in our community. I just heard today that there are 1,400 youth in our community. We have about dozen somewhat active churches in Pipestone with a population of 4,300. The goal should be to reach these people, most of whom are unchurched.

Prayer and worship were our strongest categories while discipleship and evangelism were our weakest. In fellowship, we scored healthy in areas of people feeling quickly loved and accepted when they began attending and in the feeling of belonging. However, we scored very unhealthy as people believed the priority focus of the church should be meeting the needs of the members while many do not attempt to reach other people. This inward focus is what is considered unhealthy.

Who is to blame for the weaknesses? Is it me as the pastor? Is it CTK's appointed leadership? Is it you? Is it our schedules or priorities? If we are honest, we can all raise our hands. Then who gets the credit for the strengths? We have some very encouraging strengths as far as what we believe in regard to doctrine, prayer and discipleship and in regard to what we have experienced in worship and fellowship.

I am asking that each of us would contemplate the letter to the church in Ephesus found in Revelation 2:1-7. I believe Christ loves us deeply and wants to do more with us. Let's thank God for His deliverance through Jesus and His guidance through His Spirit as we devote ourselves to understanding and applying this letter to ourselves and our church. Write to the angel of the church in Ephesus: Thus says the one who holds the seven stars in his right hand and who walks among the seven golden lampstands: ²I know your works, your labor, and your endurance, and that you cannot tolerate evil people. You have tested those who call themselves apostles and are not, and you have found them to be liars. ³I know that you have persevered and endured hardships for the sake of my name, and you have not grown weary. ⁴But I have this against you: You have abandoned the love you had at first. ⁵Remember then how far you have fallen; repent, and do the works you did at first. Otherwise, I will come to you and remove your lampstand from its place, unless you repent. ⁶Yet you do have this: You hate the practices of the Nicolaitans, which I also hate. ⁷Let anyone who has ears to hear listen to what the Spirit says to the churches. To the one who conquers, I will give the right to eat from the tree of life, which is in the paradise of God.





He served congregations in Kalispell, MT, and Newark, IL. In 2007, Pastor Swanson accepted a call to serve the two congregations at Naknek, Alaska.

Pastor Swanson and his family have endeared themselves to the community through their humble service. Please keep them in your prayers.

The Net is an important part of the Alaska Ministry:

"What is the ministry of The Net? It's a Sanctuary in a sea of chaos and unrest. It's a place where strangers are treated like family. One young woman walking in breathed deeply, "This place smells like love." Our table is laid with fresh coffee, hot cocoa, lemonade, water, iced tea and platters of fresh baked goods and a basket of packaged snacks and candies. A few tables with chairs, a well worn couch and coffee table invite guests to stay awhile. The walls hold bookshelves with Bibles, devotionals and Scripture tracts to feed the mind and nurture the soul. Board games and puzzles are stacked on an end table, and used clothing is piled on a table in the back room.

Everything is free. Sometimes people would come to the kitchen asking where the donation basket is. We would tell them it's all a free gift to anyone who comes, just like God freely gives salvation to those who
