For our momentary light affliction is producing for us an absolutely incomparable eternal weight of glory. 2 Corinthians 4:17

I have appreciated this verse for a long time and have quoted it many times at funerals while focusing on

the "absolutely incomparable eternal weight of glory." Obviously that part is talking about our eternity being so amazing that there is no comparison to anything we currently know. Compared to our current world, it is not only incomparable, but absolutely incomparable.

There are times, I'm ashamed to admit, where I have gotten an almost defeatist attitude toward life to the point where the only thing keeping me going is knowing that there is something



better to come and I'd just as soon experience it now. You could argue that's not an attitude to be ashamed about. We should look forward to our eternal destiny. However, when we fail, or in this case, when I fail to see the need to live out this life to its fullest because of affliction, then I have missed a certain word in the above verse that changes everything.

"For our momentary light affliction is producing for us..." Did you catch the word "producing?" Our affliction has the purpose of producing an absolutely incomparable eternal weight of glory. It's so easy to inflate our affliction and view it as something to avoid at all costs, when the opposite should be the case.

Notice that the text calls our affliction momentary and light. Affliction hardly ever seems light and it always sticks around longer than we prefer. At least that's our perception. But perceptions can be wrong and even change. I've been a pastor here for over 11 years and it has been the fastest 11 years of my ministry. Obviously, the length of years has not changed, but my perception of time has changed.

I believe God is leading us to a similar change in perception in regard to affliction. When our affliction is compared to eternity, the affliction will melt into a distant memory in light of the absolutely incomparable eternal weight of glory. So, let's try to view our affliction in light of eternity. It truly is short (temporal) and our perception will one day see it as light.

Also, our affliction is changing us for the better. Verse sixteen says, "Therefore we do not give up. Even though our outer person is being destroyed, our inner person is being renewed day by day." This renewing changes our perception and we begin to experience God using affliction to do a good work in us. Look how God used the affliction of His Son on the cross to do an eternal work of redemption for the world. Affliction produces something beyond comparison.

None of us can totally avoid affliction in this life, so, why not have the attitude, "Game on!" Let affliction do its work and watch for God's work in and around you. Also, know that this will just make your future better. Before you know it, that absolutely incomparable eternal weight of glory will be here and we will say, "My, that was pretty momentary and light and this is pretty amazing!"


