Science and Worship

The smell of weathered wood, dying Asian beetles, and musty carpet is still fresh in my mind. The setting was an old one-room church tucked in the hills of rural Wisconsin. Every Sunday I sat in the second oak pew with my family careful not to move the wrong way in case I would get a splinter. I was 5 years old. My dad was the pastor. Our congregation consisted of one other family, a widow, a widower, and occasional vacationers that dropped by.

What I remember just as powerfully as the smell of the Asian beetles, was the joy of worship. It was in this tiny church that the awe of Jesus became real to me. We sang hymns like *Jesus is All the World to Me* and *What a Friend We Have in Jesus*. Our contemporary songs were choruses like *As the Deer* and *Shine, Jesus, Shine*. Worship was more than song, it was the sermon, the responsive readings, the Scripture, and the Christian fellowship. It was a majestic encounter with my holy and gracious Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Worship—we all long for it. Even the unbeliever finds some place or arena to experience transcendence. It could be a sci-fi movie, a book, or a cultic practice, but we all long to imagine a place outside our physical world. But something has changed. 21st Century Americans are constantly told that we must not believe anything that cannot be explained through science. We have elevated science and lost the wonder of worship. Consider these words from author, song writer, and worship leader, Zac Hicks who I recently had the privilege of studying under:

...Our once enchanted world—a context in which the average person understood life to be a wondrous, fearful interaction between the natural and supernatural realms—has been ravaged by modernity's attempt to explain everything in scientific, naturalistic terms. Our frantic pursuit of understanding everything from the cellular to the cosmic has dulled our awe and muted our imagination by offering us a false sense of control over the created order... The constant barrage of the "explainability" of everything leaves us left with very little wonderment to bring into worship, resulting in several generations of Christians who have lost the expectation that God is really present in our worship. (Hicks, 2016, p. 30)

When the 5-year-old me sat in a pew in rural Wisconsin, there was no doubt in my mind that I was experiencing God through worship. I had not yet been trained in skeptical the land of academia. Worship for me was not a dissection, but an experience with my Creator through His Word. Consider the wonder of the Psalmist, "How lovely is your dwelling place, O Lord of hosts! My soul longs, yes, even faints for the courts of the LORD; my heart and flesh sing for joy to the living God... For a day in Your courts is better than a thousand elsewhere. I would rather be a doorkeeper in the house of my God than dwell in the tents of wickedness." O that our hearts would "long" and "faint" just to be in the presence of our Savior—just to "be a doorkeeper" in the place where God is worshipped!

23 years ago, a successful church in the UK did a courageous thing. They were a church known for their music (after all, their musician was Matt Redman), but the pastor got rid of the band and sound system for a season of time. The pastor felt that the congregation was focusing on the wrong thing in worship. Through a cappella songs (no instruments) and corporate prayers, they came to realize that the heart of worship is nothing more than a love for Jesus. As the congregation began to reincorporate the sound system and praise band, Matt Redman penned the words of the well-known praise song. May this be the cry of our heart:

*When the music fades, all is stripped away, and I simply come
 Longing just to bring something that's of worth that will bless your heart
 I'll bring You more than a song for a song in itself is
 not what You have required
 You search much deeper within through the way
 things appear
 You're looking into my heart
 I'm coming back to the heart of worship,
 And it's all about You, all about You, Jesus
 I'm sorry Lord for the thing I've made it
 When it's all about You all about You, Jesus

Trustee Meeting Minutes Christ The King Free Lutheran Church
August 12, 2021 7:00 pm

Present: Jim Gawerecki, Jim Otter, Dave Sutherland, Marcine Olsen, Laurie Bruns, Heather De Wilde, Brandie Hulstein
Absent: Morgan McNickle, Bill VanderPlaats, Pastor Matthew
Also Present: Pastor Tim, Intern Sam Willard, Collene Landgren, Mike Morgan, Wayne Smith, Lester Landgren
President Jim Gawerecki called the meeting to order. Devotions were led by Jim Otter reading from Our Daily Bread, "Listening Matters based on Psalm 85:8. The devotional related how the wireless operator on the RMS Carpathia happened to hear the distress message from the Titanic and were able to save 706 people. The writer of Psalm 85 urges us to listen to God and be obedient and God promises peace. We need to remain vigilant to God's leading. Jim O. led in prayer. Laurie Bruns will lead devotions in September.

Elders' Consultation: Wayne S. reported for the Elders. The elders and wives will meet next week and continue the study, Overcoming the Dark Side of Leadership, the emphasis is on recognizing different personality traits and identifying the dark side of some of the traits. The study is going to move toward redeeming the dark side.

The Treasurer's report for July was presented. Brandie H. moved to accept the treasurer's report. Seconded by Jim O. Motion carried.

Youth Ministry and Family Ministry Reports:

Youth Ministry: Intern Sam and Pastor Tim reported for the youth ministry. The youth went to Thunder Road on August 11, about 10 youth attended. Pastor Matthew & Intern Sam have been meeting to plan curriculum for Wednesday night youth group. Confirmation classes will be held on Sunday morning during Sunday school time. Wednesday night youth group will be grades 7-12 and Forge will be grades 5 & 6.

Family Ministry: Pastor Tim & Intern Sam reported for the family ministry. CTK had an entry for the Water Tower festival parade, 16 to 18 people walked in the parade. Pastor Matthew ordered t shirts with CTK printed on them for those walking. There will be a Love Pipestone Event on August 21 from 9 AM to noon. This event is with the Pipestone ministerial. CTK will be helping with the laundry ministry and paying for laundry costs. The pool party is scheduled for

August 13 from 6 to 7 PM with an ice cream social following at the park. Heather D. reported the progressive dinner that was planned for August 21 has been postponed until after the first of the year.

Pastors' Report: **Pastor Tim** submitted a report of activities for the last month. Pastor Tim reported confirmation classes will be held on Sunday mornings during Sunday school time. The youth are exhausted after a long day of classes, practice and then coming to confirmation and youth group. Also, Wednesdays are going to be an early out of school for the school year. Sunday school is being organized; Janelle Brockberg has agreed to continue to be superintendent. Answers in Genesis will be used for all classes. Laurie Westerbur will be teaching first year confirmation; Pastor Matthew second year, and Pastor Tim will lead third year.

Pastor Matthew submitted a report for May & June. Marcine moved, seconded by Brandie H. to approve the request for time off September 2 - 7. Motion carried. Elder recommendations for pastor job description: Tabled The trustees are going to look at developing an employee handbook.

Van rental / purchase: Tabled

Live stream equipment: Lester Landgren submitted a list of items compiled by Pastor Matthew for Media/Technology wish list. There are a few changes to be made with this to try to streamline Sunday morning tech. Dave S. moved, seconded by Laurie B. to get Office 365 for CTK computers.

New Business: Account sign-in information: A central place, such as secretary office, to keep sign in information for accounts for various places CTK orders materials or subscriptions.

Ice Skating Rink: Pastor Matthew would like to develop an ice-skating rink on the grass south of the parking lot. This would involve building a frame and flooding the area. Jim G. instructed Collene to check with insurance about liability.

5th Quarter @ CTK: Pastor Matthew requested the youth be allowed to meet at CTK following home football games for snacks, bonfire, and a time of fellowship. The first home game is September 2. Participating churches would rotate for providing snacks. The consensus is to go ahead with this, Jim O. will make a bigger fire ring.

Vacuum: Get a new backpack vacuum next time it needs repairs.

Other: Collene L. mentioned Amberlie will be having shoulder surgery the end of September and may have to help her occasionally so will be in later in the morning.

Dave S. moved, seconded by Heather D. to adjourn the meeting. Jim G. adjourned the meeting, Wayne S. closed in prayer. Collene Landgren, recording secretary {Draft subject to approval by the trustees}

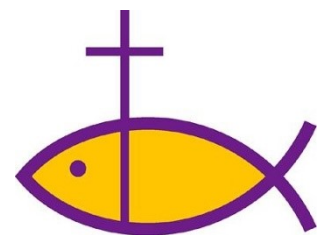

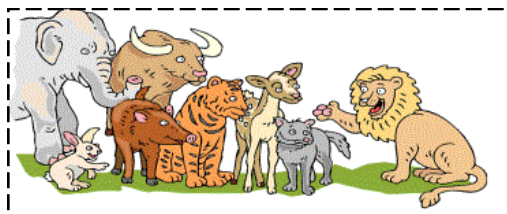

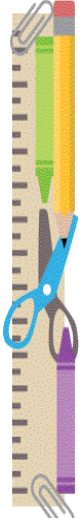
